the disjuncture between the design intent of the developers of icts and the needs of the users has often led to surprising use of new technologies as users have refused to become mere agents of the designers individual users have adopted their own uses of icts based on the complex webs of relations and meanings in which they function as social actors instead of adjusting these webs to new icts they have fit the icts into their pre existing social webs often resulting in imaginative and creative uses of new technologies not envisaged by the original

designers the contributions in this volume provide studies of such integrations of icts into the lives of human users and demonstrate that such uses should not be regarded as faulty or mistaken merely because they fail to meet the expectations of the original designers of the icts instead human users should be given precedence over icts and the creative uses of universal technologies by individual users should be emphasised and studied so as to move towards a better understanding and appreciation of the integration of icts into human lives this book was originally published as special issue of the information society

we are often told that social media well being is simply the result of individual users making healthy digital choices all it takes is a little self discipline in this book niall docherty looks closely at this belief and exposes the complex relations of power expressed through its articulation and enactment docherty creatively and empirically shows how the discourses designs and habits of online well being push user conduct in certain directions at the expense of others this is a contingent mode of governance that combines logics of neoliberalism practices of psychologized person making and persuasive capitalist interfaces by highlighting the damaging effects of this current arrangement healthy users charts a path that will change how we understand and study social media well being in the future

introduces a new framework for the study of ideology in written language using the tools methods and theories of pragmatics and discourse analysis the book is intended as a teaching tool in language discourse and communication oriented programs but also for historians and social and political scientists

in examining how our identity shapes the knowledge we produce mental health service users in research considers ways of doing research which bring multiple understandings together effectively and explains the sociological use of autobiography and its relevance

a chilling account of the tradeoff we are willing to make between interactive media technologies and the power of others to watch over and control us this brave new world of electronic marketing and consumption actually lulls consumers into blissful ignorance of how that usage can be and is being monitored

assessing exposures and reducing risks to people from the use of pesticides will focus on practices that have been developed in the past 10 years marked from the passage of the food quality protection act and other pertinent legislation eg the clean air act amendments which

deal all or in part with reducing risks associated with pesticides

iran the green movement and the usa presents the dilemma that the west faces in dealing with the islamic republic of iran and their nuclear armament and how the unfolding civil rights movement in iran the green movement will be affected by this interaction iranian scholar and author hamid dabashi argues that if obama negotiates with ahmadinejad he will further strengthen the iri regionally and legitimize ahmadinejad s otherwise troubled presidency internationally and if he were not to do so and opt for further economic sanctions and or

military strikes he will paradoxically strengthen the iri regionally and altogether destroy the domestic opposition and the budding green movement this elegantly written book presents an iran weak in domestic affairs but strong in regional geopolitics providing the reader with a dynamic picture of the region and a purposeful analytic of how to understand and deal with it it also features a short history of how the us and iran were placed in this confrontational position and who their respective allies in the region are
